# Purple Spray & Sea of Purple Hardenbergia

Hardenbergia is a climbing or prostrate Australian native. Hardenbergia are known for their fast growing nature, low maintenance requirements, and stunning flower show from late winter/early spring.

## Sea of Purple

A vigorous and low growing ground cover, Sea of Purple offers masses of flowers and an even spread of up to 3 metres. It's long trailing stems form a dense mat up to 30cm high, great for erosion control and weed suppression. Ideal as a ground cover and over retaining walls.

### Purple Spray

Purple Spray is a hardy, compact variety with manageable twining stems. Due to its upright branching habit of 1.5m, Purple Spray presents will in pots and also has a tendency to run up walls or fences and ball at the top; perfect for hiding a fence or structure with its masses of purple flowers.

- Thick foliage great for erosion control and weed suppression

HEIGHT	Sea of Purple: 30cm Purple Spray: 1.5m	
WIDTH	Sea of Purple: 3m+ Purple Spray: 1m	
HABIT	Sea of Purple: low growing ground cover Purple Spray: Upright, compact habit	
MAINTENANCE	Cut back after flowering to maintain shape. Prune more regularly if needing even coverage by taking old flower heads while plant is growing. Protect from frost and harsh afternoon sun	
SEASONAL CLIMATE ZONE	Zones 1 to 3	
RECOMMENDED POT/PLUG RATIO	1 plug per 140mm pot	
FLOWERING PERIOD	Late winter/early spring	
GROWING MEDIA PH RANGE	pH 6-6.5	
WATERING	Do not allow pots to become waterlogged. Most watering systems will be suitable.	
FERTILISER	Fertilise with native fertiliser in autumn and again after flowering if required,	
PESTS & DISEASES	Elsinoe Leafspot of Hardenbergia. Excellent nursery hygiene is required. Remove all dropped leaves from around pots and begin preventative spray regime. Hardenbergia mosaic virus, thrips, aphids, attractive to wallabies.	
FINISHING TIMES	12-14 weeks	
LIGHT REQUIREMENT	Full sun
